Historical Note

Paul F. Brautigam graduated from Carnegie Technical Institute, 1931. He was the Music Supervisor of the Pittsburgh Public Schools, 1950-1971. Brautigam was Choir Director at Southminster Presbyterian Church of Mt. Lebanon, 1954-1964; Wallace Memorial Presbyterian Church of Green Tree, 1965-1981; Emory Methodist Church, 1946-1954; and others.
