Notes on the Collection

Historical Note

Charles L. Babo Sr. started the Pittsburgh Letter Carriers Band in 1923. They rehearsed at the (then) main Post Office at 4th Ave. and Smithfield St. in downtown Pittsburgh. The Pittsburgh Letter Carriers Band was a "Big Band" that had anywhere between 15-30 players. They would play at National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) Conventions, Pittsburgh parades and festivals, and before Pittsburgh sporting events. The band was named after a Pennsylvania congressman, Clyde Kelly, who supported the NALC, a labor union which originated in 1899, and became an affiliate of the American Federation of Labor (AFL) in 1917.
