# Notes on the Collection

# **Historical Note**

Homer Wickline (1911–1996) was born in Pittsburgh, where he lived most of his life. He was highly regarded as a composer, organist, pianist, teacher, and accompanist. He studied organ with Caspar Koch. In 1932 he was appointed Minister of Music at Crafton Heights United Presbyterian Church. From 1935 to 1948 he was accompanist and assistant conductor of the Mendelssohn Choir. He was hired as organist and music director of Highland Presbyterian Church in Aspinwall in 1939. He regularly performed on KDKA in the 1950s. He was Music Minister at Mulberry United Presbyterian Church from 1956-1973, after which he moved to St. James Catholic Church in Wilkinsburg. He performed nearly 600 free weekly organ recitals in Pittsburgh area churches throughout the 1970s and 1980s and made a point never to repeat a program.
