Abstract

The Pittsburgh Orchestra, in existence from 1896 – 1910, was Pittsburgh's world renown, premier orchestra during Andrew Carnegie's heyday. The Music Department holds the archives of the Pittsburgh Orchestra including correspondence, contracts, concert programs, newspaper clippings, notes, publicity flyers, and other ephemera.
