## Notes on the Collection

## Historical Note

Victor Saudek, born in Milwaukee, moved to Pittsburgh in 1908 to play flute for three seasons in the Pittsburgh Orchestra under the direction of Emil Paur. When the Pittsburgh Orchestra disassembled, he formed the Saudek Ensemble, a chamber music ensemble with former orchestra members. Saudek was the flute instructor at the Carnegie Institute of Technology for 25 years starting in 1913. Saudek directed the KDKA Little Symphony Orchestra beginning in 1922, the first orchestra organized exclusively for the radio, and broadcast one of the world's first live orchestral concerts. His radio lectures on KDKA about music were the first of their kind. The KDKA Little Symphony Orchestra gave free pops concerts on the lawn of the Schenley Hotel starting in 1932.
